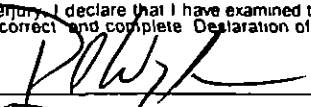
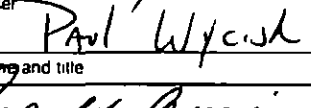

The League receives no special discounts from Pitney Bowes.
- 2 During 2002, National Urban League Board of Trustees member Kenneth Lewis, the Chairman and CEO of Bank of America, was the League's Vice Chairman. The League uses Banc of America (a wholly owned subsidiary of Bank of America) as one of its money managers. Banc of America, through a RFP process that included several vendors, was selected to become one of the League's money managers. The League receives no special discounts from Bank of America.
- 3 During 2002, Andy Taylor, the Chairman and CEO of Enterprise Rent-a-Car, was a member of the League's Board of Trustees. Enterprise Rent-a-Car is the League's car rental company of choice. Prior to Mr. Taylor's appointment as a member of the League's Board of Trustees, Enterprise, through a RFP process that included several vendors, was selected. League staff are not required to use Enterprise, however, only if they are the most cost efficient available option.
- 4 During 2002, Robert Brown, the Chairman and CEO of B&C Associates, Inc., was a member of the League's Board of Trustees. The League uses B&C as our endowment campaign consultants. Prior to Mr. Brown's appointment as a member of the League's Board of Trustees, B&C Associates, Inc. was selected to provide the League endowment campaign consultants by participating in a RFP bidding process that included several vendors.
