(a) **Direct Mail Campaigns** – America Needs Fatima was the Foundations main direct mail campaign this year. It's goal is to spread the Fatima message of prayer and conversion throughout America. This year, a total of 1.2 million letters to current America Needs Fatima campaign members in a total of eleven mailings. As part of the direct mail outreach, 127,500 signs advertising Rosary Rallies, 100,000 copies of the book *Fatima: A Message More Urgent than Ever*, and 85,000 Holy Face prayer cards were distributed free of charge. Also, protest postcards were distributed to ANF members to send to theaters showing *Jerry Springer: the Opera in Concert* and the blasphemous movie *The Ten*. *Crusade* magazine is also mailed six times a year to approximately 85,000 people, and the statement "Battling for America's Soul" was sent to 140,000 members. America Needs Fatima also distributed 1.9 million pictures of Our Lady of Fatima as part of its effort to enthrone Mary in Every Home.

(b) **Dissemination of Ideas** – Personal contact with interested individuals and organizations continues to be an important way of furthering the values of Christian civilization. This personal contact continues to be done throughout the United States. The FCC operates three offices for this purpose: in McLean, VA; Park Ridge, IL; and Long Beach, CA. The Foundation also distributed a total of 74,513 religious articles, including statues, rosaries, crucifixes, medals, Consecration cards, First Saturday pledges, and devotional audio CD's.

(c) **Publications** – In response to the California Supreme Court decision to implement same-sex marriage, the Foundation published the statement "Battling for America's Soul" in *The New York Times*, *The Los Angeles Times*, and *The Washington Times*. The organization continued publishing its bi-monthly magazine, *Crusade*, which is sent to an average of 85,000 people. The Foundation published a new book on Fatima titled: *Fatima: A Message More Urgent than Ever* and reprinted the *Jacinta's Story*. A total of 108,870 books related to the furtherance of the values of Christian civilization were distributed during the fiscal year. Also, the statement, "Is It Fair that the Innocent Pay for the Guilty?" was published in local papers in Wisconsin, Colorado and New York. Over 1,000 articles are posted on the Foundation's website, tfp.org, and is receives more than 1,000 visits each month.

(d) **Adult Formation Programs** – FCC representatives gave 2,477 presentations on the message of Our Lady at Fatima in homes, schools, and nursing homes. An estimated 26,000 people attended a Fatima presentation last year. In addition, FCC representatives contacted 25,000 people about the upcoming 2008 Rosary Rallies by telephone. As part of the FCC's outreach program, twenty-five Fatima Custodian Auxiliaries take a statue of Our Lady of Fatima to a friend's home, where the statue remains for a week. FCC representatives also spoke to over 4,000 people who called our America Needs Fatima hotline. The Foundation continued its work with families, with FCC representatives giving bi-monthly lectures in eight major cities.

Line 93e – Money received from the vandal for repair of a vandalized statue of Our Lady on the organization's property, helps further the values of Christian civilization because of the religious nature of the Statue.

Line 93h – Sales of non-inventory rosary kits help further the values of Christian civilization not just by supporting the organization financially, but by explaining and spreading devotion to the rosary.

Line 102 – The sales of the organization's inventory help further the values of Christian civilization not just financially, but because of the religious nature of the items.

Attachment to Part III, Line 3a – Grant and Scholarship Making Criteria

The Foundation for a Christian Civilization, Inc. ("FCC") has adopted the following guidelines for making grants (scholarships included) to organizations and individuals:

Scholarships to individuals:

Selection of grantees will be made on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis using criteria reasonably related to the purpose of the grant, including the merits of the proposal, if any, credentials of the potential grantee, the relationship of the proposal to the Foundation's program activities, projects or areas of concern and its priority in relation to other demands on Foundation funds.

Grants to Organizations

The Foundation will conduct an inquiry concerning the potential grantee before the grant is made. Such inquiry shall be sufficient to provide reasonable assurance that the grantee will use the grant for the purpose for which it is made. The inquiry will include the organization's prior history and experience, management, activities, and practices. Where the Foundation makes grants that are earmarked for the use of another grantee organization, the inquiry will encompass both the recipient organization and the organization for which the funds are earmarked.

Grants to organizations that have not been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as exempt from tax pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 will only be made for specific charitable projects in furtherance of the Foundation's tax-exempt purposes.
