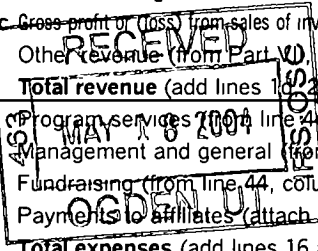

EXPANDED STATEMENT OF ACTIVITIES

The purpose of V-Day is to stop all forms of violence against women and girls around the world. Specifically, V-Day's activities are focused on raising awareness of the issues of violence against women and girls, empowering local communities, and working with anti-violence activists worldwide to end rape, incest, domestic battery and female genital mutilation.

The money raised by V-Day to support its activities comes from individuals, corporations, foundations, benefit events and donations from production companies and theaters staging commercial performances of "The Vagina Monologues." V-Day makes direct awards to grassroots, national and international organizations and programs that work to end rape, battery, incest, female genital mutilation (FGM) and sexual slavery. V-Day made direct awards totaling over \$560,000 in 2002-2003, nationally and internationally, to 52 groups who are working to end violence against women and girls. These awards are detailed in the attachment to Part II, line 22 of Form 990 that follows this narrative.

In support of its programmatic and educational goals, V-Day conducts the following activities:

V-DAY – In February and March each year, V-Day organizes large-scale educational and community building events in the U.S. and internationally to raise awareness and support for local, national, and international non-profit organizations who work to stop violence against women and girls. V-Day acts as a catalyst, bringing together women to learn from each other and develop strategies that will work in their communities to end the violence. These events include films, workshops, education and capacity building, conferences, art exhibitions, coalition building and development of strategies to end violence against women and girls. The events include locally produced performances of *The Vagina Monologues* that benefit organizations in the local communities that are working to end the violence against women and girls.

During V-Day's 2003 season (February-March 2003) V-Day events were organized and presented by volunteer activists around the world, educating millions of people about the reality of violence against women and girls. These events raised over \$2.2 million that benefited over 1,000 organizations in the U.S. and worldwide in such places as Sarajevo, Lubumbashi, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Mexico City, Florence, Paris, and Nairobi.

V-DAY WORLDWIDE INITIATIVE: In February-March 2003, there were V-Day Worldwide Initiative events in 295 cities in 34 countries. The proceeds of these events are donated by the local organizers directly to beneficiaries in their communities.

Statement of Program Activities

Worldwide Initiative events help to build and sustain a local base of support for anti-violence groups. These events further V-Day's mission by having a life-changing effect on audiences everywhere – raising awareness about violence against women and girls, and the negative psychological and physical effects borne by women around the world. In 2002-2003, the proceeds from these independent productions totaled over \$950,000 which was donated directly by the local organization to over 350 non-profit groups who work to further V-Day's goals. These groups are listed in the attachment to Part III of Form 990 that follows this narrative: "2002-2003 Worldwide & College Initiative Beneficiaries".

V-DAY COLLEGE INITIATIVE: V-Day works with colleges and universities around the world to support campus-based activities to educate students about violence against women and girls. Independent benefit performances of *The Vagina Monologues* are produced with student actors and volunteers and all proceeds are donated directly by the student groups to local organizations who work to stop violence that are selected by the students. V-Day provides technical assistance and support to these campus groups. In 2002-2003, there were events in 602 colleges and universities in 18 countries that raised and donated over \$1,250,000 to local anti-violence organizations. These groups are listed in the attachment to Part III of Form 990 that follows this narrative: "2002-2003 Worldwide & College Initiative Beneficiaries".

SPOTLIGHT ON INDIAN COUNTRY: In 2002, V-Day began its Indian Country Initiative, staging a V-Day in Rapid City, South Dakota to increase awareness about the issue of domestic violence on the reservations. Led by Indian Country Director, Suzanne Blue Star Boy, in 2003, 25 V-Day celebrations took place on or to benefit reservations and Native American and First Nations women across the United States and Canada.

INTERNATIONAL STOP-RAPE COMPETITION: In 2001-2002, V-Day, and its program partner Equality Now, organized and conducted an international competition to solicit innovative and effective strategies to stop rape from women around the world. The competition was judged by 12 international regional coordinators and the winners receive awards from V-Day to implement their strategies. This program continued in 2002-2003 with awards detailed in the attachment to Part II, line 22 of Form 990 that follows this narrative.

TASURU GIRLS RESCUE CENTER: To further its goal to end female genital mutilation, V-Day, with its Kenyan program partner, Tasuru Girls Rescue Center, opened a demonstration Safe House in Narok, Kenya in 2002 to provide a place for Maasai girls to go to escape genital mutilation and forced marriage and to create alternative coming-of-age rituals so that they can take their place as women in their communities. V-Day continues its support, both financially and programmatically, for this program.

DOCUMENTARY FILM “UNTIL THE VIOLENCE STOPS”: In 2002, V-Day began the production of a documentary film that followed V-Day founder Eve Ensler and V-Day activists around the world, showing how V-Day’s worldwide campaign is interpreted in different locations and highlighting the issues of violence that are most relevant to the communities in which the events are held. During 2002-2003, V-Day raised funds from supporters for and undertook the production and editing of the film. The film will be used as an educational tool by V-Day.

V-WORLD SUMMIT: In September 2002, V-Day organized and hosted the V-World Summit in Rome, Italy with over 25 anti-violence activists from 15 countries represented. The purpose of the Summit was to bring anti-violence activists together to discuss their strategies, build coalitions, gain strength from each other, and build a worldwide movement to end violence against women and girls. The Summit was partially funded by V-Day and its US and International program partners: the Global Fund for Women and Mama Cash.

AWARD PROCEDURES 2002-2003

The goal of V-Day is to stop all forms of violence against women and girls around the world. V-Day makes awards to nonprofit groups in the U.S. and around the world who are dedicated to raising awareness of the issues and who are actively working to end rape, incest, domestic battery and female genital mutilation. V-Day makes several different types of awards:

V-Day Direct Awards

V-Day makes awards to strategic partners who help implement its goals and to outstanding groups around the world who are working to end violence against women and girls. V-Day funds its program partners Equality Now and Tasaru Ntomok (Safe House for Girls in Kenya) to carry out specific programs that advance its goals. It makes awards for programs like V-Day's New York City High School initiative to raise awareness about violence among teenage girls and for the creation and maintenance of anti-violence information resources such as the on-line directory provided by Feminist.com. V-Day awards are recommended by members of the board of directors, staff and program partners and approved by the board. Each awardee must submit its 501(c)(3) determination or equivalency statement and is asked for a 6 month progress report.

International Stop Rape Awards

V-Day, working with its program partner Equality Now, organizes and conducts an international competition to solicit innovative and effective strategies from women around the world to stop rape. Approximately 8 international groups are selected. The competition is judged by 12 regional coordinators (activists from around the world) and the winners receive awards from V-Day to implement their strategies. V-Day and Equality Now monitor the implementation of each award and mid-term and final reports are received by V-Day.

V-Day Event Local Awards

Each year, V-Day fund raising events are held in several cities (New York, San Francisco, Washington, D.C.) that raise funds for V-Day and for local
