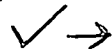

AT&T FOUNDATION EMPLOYEE DISASTER RELIEF FUND GUIDELINES

1. Qualified Disasters

A qualified disaster is a situation wherein large numbers of people suddenly find themselves in need of food, clothing, shelter, medical care or other basic necessities, and the following two conditions are met:

a.) A disaster occurs that (1) results from certain terrorist or military actions, (2) is a Presidentially declared disaster, or (3) results from an accident involving a common carrier, or any other event, that the Secretary of the Treasury determines is catastrophic; and,

b.) The Chairman – AT&T Foundation designates the disaster as a qualified disaster authorizing the Fund to be used to provide assistance to eligible persons. The Chairman – AT&T Foundation shall consider the magnitude of the disaster in determining whether the disaster is large enough in scope to be considered a qualified disaster.

2. Eligibility

Active management and nonmanagement employees and retirees (receiving post-retirement benefits), and their families, of any AT&T Inc. company are eligible. Directors and officers of the AT&T Foundation and employees serving on the Distribution Committee are ineligible.

3. Contributions

The AT&T Foundation will accept contributions to the Fund from interested individuals, corporations, and other organizations, including employees of any AT&T Inc. company. Because of Federal tax rules, the AT&T Foundation cannot accept contributions to the Fund that are earmarked for specific individuals.

4. Type of Assistance

The Fund may provide assistance in multiple forms and assistance may be both short-term and long-term. Assistance can be provided as grants or loans. Provided that assistance to any one eligible individual, including their family, shall not exceed \$25,000.

For example, the Fund may provide emergency, short-term financial assistance to meet a variety of needs, including food, clothing, physical and mental health care, housing, transportation, education, and other basic

necessities. The Fund may also be used to provide ongoing assistance with longer-term needs, including housing, childcare, tuition, and physical and mental health care. The determination of the form and amount of assistance shall be made by the Distribution Committee, which shall have full and complete discretion within the guidelines set forth herein.

It is intended that the assistance provided under this program comply with the requirements of section 139 of the Internal Revenue Code.

5. Distribution Committee

An AT&T Foundation Board-appointed Distribution Committee is responsible for reviewing requests for assistance, selecting recipients, and disbursing funds.

The committee should consist of at least five members. No more than two members may be executive officers or senior managers of AT&T Inc. and its subsidiaries. Federal tax rules require that employees who are committee members reflect a broad range of employees not limited to executives and that these employees act in a personal capacity as agents of the AT&T Foundation rather than as representatives of AT&T Inc. The Foundation shall indemnify employees acting in a personal capacity.

Committee members shall serve for a term of one year and may not serve for more than three consecutive one-year terms.

6. Request Form

Request forms must be completed for individuals seeking assistance. In addition to biographical and other basic information, the request form must describe the type of assistance sought (e.g., medical, housing, childcare, tuition) and the amount of assistance requested. The form must also elicit information and documentation regarding the applicant's personal financial circumstances and level of need and/or distress. The extent of the documentation required will depend upon the type and amount of assistance sought. Federal tax rules permit distribution of short-term assistance (such as blankets, hot meals, electric fans or coats, hats and gloves) without the detailed documentation required above.

7. Evaluation and Selections of Recipients

Factors to be considered by the Committee in selecting recipients will include (i) the extent to which the applicant is needy or distressed at the time of the request, (ii) the type of assistance sought (short-term vs. long-term) and (iii) the amount requested. Race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, sexual orientation, marital status, citizenship status, veteran

status, or disability shall not be considered a factor in the selection of recipients.

8. Program Funding

In the event the qualified disaster conditions are met, the AT&T Foundation Board will be asked to approve funding based on assessment of the scope of the impact.
